Ideas not to forget: Many times in the treatment of constraint patterns qì rectifying herbs are used. Qì rectifying herbs are fragrant and dry and can damage yīn. In chronic disease yīn and blood are secretly consumed therefore one must be cautious in their use. Chinese herbs that rectify qì but do not damage the yīn are: fo shou, xiang fu, bai ji li, lu e mei, mei gui hua, jie luo. (These are suitable to use with yīn vacuity and chronic disease)

Translator's Comments:

One should notice the fine differentiations made between seemingly ordinary patterns such as liver qi constraint. The liver-spleen and liver-stomach are common differentiations, but the chronic constraint entering the network vessels is a somewhat overlooked pattern. One can see that the pulse becomes deep, emotions start to become more active, there starts to become a chance of insomnia. This pattern is starting to show signs of blood stagnation (arising from qi stagnation) – Hence the diagnosis 'entering the network vessels'. It is a long-term problem and because of this a very different herbal approach is undertaken, moving the blood with xuan fu hua tang.
